The Fight for Pay Equity

In 2017, median annual earnings for men in California were \$52,487. Compare that to the median of \$46,783 for California's women that same year.

Though it doesn't sound like it, by some measurements this is good news. Despite the fact California's working women earn less than its male workers do, our state *ranks first in the nation* in gender pay equity progress and also in pay equity protections enacted into law.



The bad news of course is that women's earnings ratio was still just 89 percent of that which their male counterparts earned. And, as you might expect, the gap is worse for most women of color and working mothers.

If we look closer to home, our District 10 women's median earnings were \$41,837 or only 82.7 percent of men's median earnings of \$50,570. Out of 53 Districts in our state, our area ranks 33rd.

All the above data was compiled by AAUW nationwide and each of us can be proud our organization is, and always has been, in the lead in pursuing fair pay in our country. The results of AAUW's extensive pay equity research is on its website and each of us can learn more by going to aauw.org/fairpay/. If you are still employed you can benefit from taking a free AAUW online course in negotiating fair and equal pay. 
