
California Book Club

INDIVIDUAL IMPACT

- 1 in 20 U.S. adults (5%) have serious thoughts of suicide each year.
- About 1 person dies by suicide in the U.S. every 11 minutes.
- 79% of all people who die by suicide in the U.S. are male.*
- Although more women* than men attempt suicide, men are 4x more likely to die by suicide.
- In the U.S., suicide is the 2nd leading cause of death among people ages 10-14 and among people ages 15-24, and the 11th leading cause of death overall. (NAMI, 2025)

EMPOWERING FUTURES: AAUW HIGH SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

AAUW continues its long-standing commitment to empowering young women through education with its annual High School Scholarships. Each year, our Turlock/Modesto branch awards scholarships to outstanding high school seniors who demonstrate academic excellence, leadership potential, and a dedication to advancing gender equity with a focus on a career in a STEM discipline (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math).

Our branch developed the scholarship program in 2018 with 3 local high schools, and currently we award students at 5 high schools: Turlock, Pitman, Modesto High (renamed the Pat Portwood Scholarship in 2024) Ceres, and Enochs. In the past 7 years we have awarded a total of 42 students, each receiving \$1,000.00. We are able to provide these funds thanks to the generosity of our members and the community who support our annual scholarship fundraiser, held in November.

The awarded students are celebrated each year in May with a luncheon held at Pageo's Lavender Farm.

The AAUW Scholarship Program is more than just financial assistance-it's an investment in the next generation of women leaders. The program is designed to support young women who are pursuing higher education at the community college or California State University.

We believe that every young woman deserves the opportunity to pursue her educational dreams. Our scholarship program not only helps ease the financial burden of college but also recognizes the remarkable achievements of young women in our community.

In 2025, our Branch awarded scholarships to 7 graduating seniors from each of our confirmed high schools. These recipients were selected through a competitive process that considered academic achievement, community involvement, and leadership experience.


