


The Reason and History Behind the Scholarship Fundraiser

AAUW has a proud history of granting scholarships to girls and women. Turlock/Modesto Branch traditionally raises money for three levels of learning. We contribute to AAUW national endowments that fund graduate level research as well as community action grants. Secondly, we offer \$1,000 scholarships to local girls in their senior year of high school. The schools include Turlock High, Pittman High, Modesto High, Enochs High, and Ceres High School. There's more! Started in California, in 1998, Tech Trek offers seventh grade girls week-long STEM summer camps held on university campuses. Most years we are able to send six girls to CSU Fresno. This camp, at \$1,000 per student, is an eye-opening and hugely affirming experience for the girls who attend. We are very proud to be able to offer Tech Trek to junior high girls, who come recommended by their math and science teachers. The fundraiser on Nov. 2 will raise the money needed to meet our scholarship goals. Each of us has a part to play in this. Ticket sales generally cover the costs of the event. Money raised by the silent auction and Fund-a-Need donations fulfill the scholarships. Please encourage attendance among your family and friends. Plan your donation!




