President Message

Welcome to our November / December issue! I'm wishing all of you a happy holiday season. Please plan to attend our Soup Supper on December 12 for fun and fellowship. Then make sure to attend our January 16 Zoom program on Reproductive Health Care Post-Dobbs. Invite your friends to learn about current reproductive issues, and action items.

I saw many of you at our Scholarship Fundraiser dinner, which was a great success! 61% of our membership attended and more sent in donations. There were close to 150 in attendance. Special thanks to Valerie Doherty and her committee for this fabulous event! The multitude and variety of silent auction items and baskets garnered lots of attention and donations. Mary Heilman's sub-committee provided truly beautiful decorations. I heard many compliments.

I have become aware that many of us do not realize that donated money is not all the same. Money donated to Tech Trek can only be used for Tech Trek; that is called a designated fund. At the national level, the huge sum of money that makes up our Fellowships and Grants is also designated funds. The **only** money that can be used "as needed" is money donated to the Greatest Needs Fund #9110. Currently, only 17% of AAUW members donated to any national fund. I became a monthly sustainer last year by donating each month. I didn't choose a large amount monthly, but every dollar makes a difference.

We want to earn 5-Star status again this year. One way to earn the branch recognition "Advancement" star from AAUW National is to have more members donate to National this year than last year. Not in dollars (although that would be nice), but individuals. So, if 10 members donated last year and this year 11 do, we have done it! Please consider making a donation.

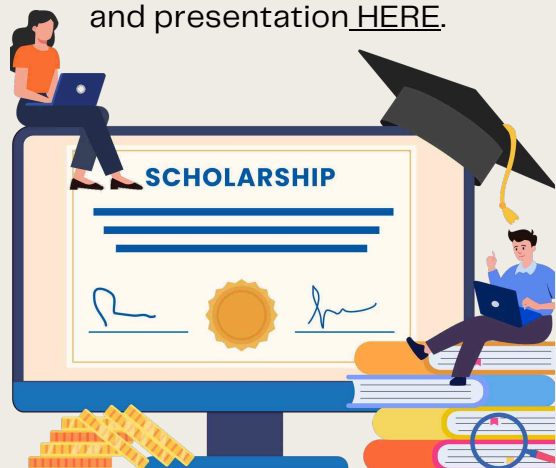

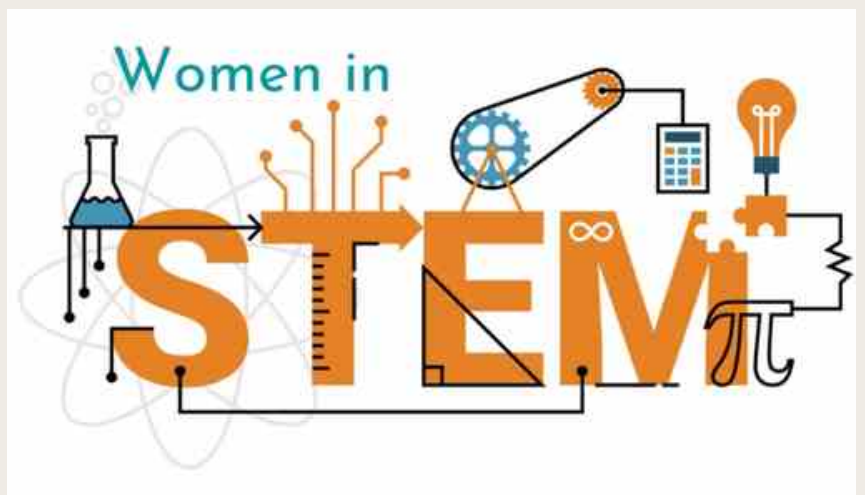
Scholarship Fundraiser Appreciation

Only for her male counterparts to never once even be mocked, laughed at or shamed

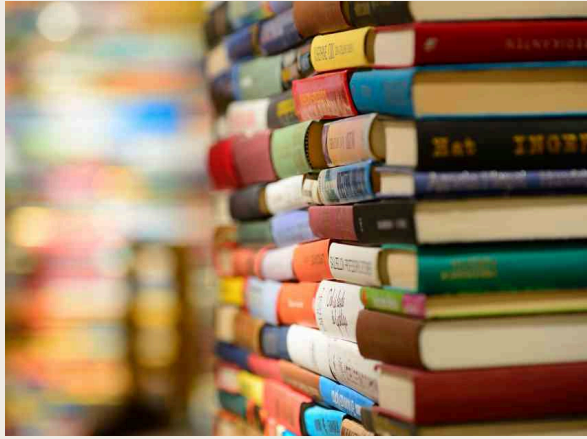
Sad and embarrassed she cries, her self-esteem diminished

It's a hard truth—there is no **gender equity** without **pay equity**. The pay gap has had a detrimental impact on people and families for generations.

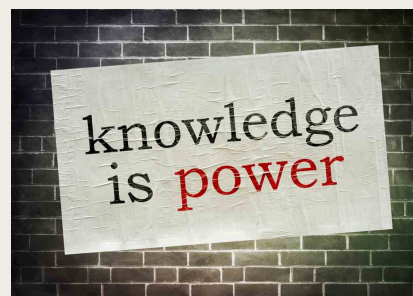
Unfortunately, after many years of slowly narrowing, the gap has actually been widening over the past two years. When including all women earners, women are paid 75 cents for every dollar paid to men. What has AAUW been doing to reverse the situation? AAUW has been providing salary negotiation, financial literacy, and advocacy training to thousands of women. Our signature document, The Not So Simple Truth, a gender pay report, is being updated with the most current data to examine root causes of persistent inequities and to highlight policies and practices that can close the pay gap. The More You Know: Online Scammers

THE MORE YOU KNOW, THE SAFER YOU ARE

Step 1: Check who it's really from

You may need to tap, click, or hover over the "From" name to see the full address.

Make sure the domain (the part after the "@") matches the actual organization.

Example: siteadmin@aauw-ca.org is legitimate; siteadmin@aauw-support.com or aauw-members@yahoo.com is not.

Watch for sneaky look-alikes: amazOn.com (zero instead of "o"), aauw-help.org instead of aauw.org or aauw-ca.org.

Step 2: Scan for common red flags

Urgent messages: "You must read this attachment/click this link right away!"

Unexpected offers or prizes: "Click here to redeem."

Requests for personal info or money, especially gift cards or wire transfers.

Links and attachments you weren't expecting. Hover your mouse over links (or press and hold on mobile) to preview the real web address. If you're unsure whether the message is legitimate, don't click if it looks unfamiliar or is shortened (like bit.ly).

Spelling or grammatical mistakes or unusual wording. This isn't always present, but it is a clue if spotted.

Step 3: What to do

If the message appears to be a scam

Do not respond to the email.

Do not click links or open attachments.

Report it as spam/phishing in your email program.

Delete it.

If you are not sure whether the message is a scam or not

Contact the purported originating agency through established channels to determine whether it is legitimate. Use an email, website, or phone number you have used before or know to be correct.

A quick summary of the high points:

Look past the sender's display name: verify the full email address and domain.

Be wary of urgency, prizes, and requests for personal info.

Do not click on links or open attachments unless you're comfortable that the message is legitimate.

Delete suspicious messages.

I hope this information is helpful. It's a rough world out there, but with a bit of knowledge and good habits, you can keep yourself safe.
